- Keep in personal contact with your child's teacher.

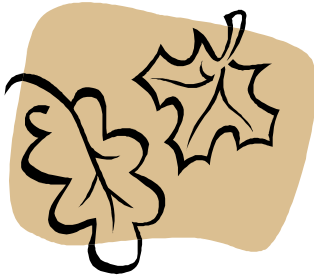
Questions to ponder-

We look forward to seeing you all there!



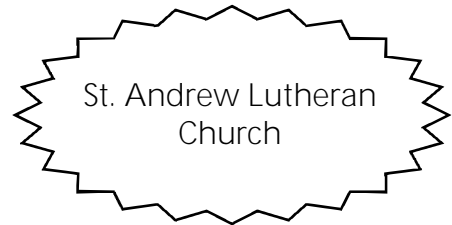

Parents Corner – Take Charge of your Child's Education.

You are your child's best advocate.

- Take charge of your child's education. Do not rely on the school district to do this for you. You know what is best for your child. Don't be afraid to voice your concern. Remember to be professional when you are at school or on the phone.
- Get to know their teacher before school starts. This will ensure your child is comfortable in their new setting and with their new teacher.
- Try to volunteer in the classroom, if possible. This will let you know how classroom management is being run. Field trips, special programs, and assemblies are also important to attend. This will set a good example for your child to see how much you support them and their school.
- Communicate with your child's teacher and school. Send a note to thank them for a impressive assignment or project. If you have their email it is also nice to communicate that way. It saves time in playing phone tag. Also respond to the school questionnaires. If the school doesn't know there is a concern, they can not address it.
- Attend PAC or PTA meetings. There is so much valuable information given at these meetings that concern the school district, region, or the school. It also show your child that you value their education and are concerned on how the schools are run.
- Check you child's backpack. Lots of information is sent from school through fliers and newsletters. Make sure you have all the information to make your child's school you successful!
